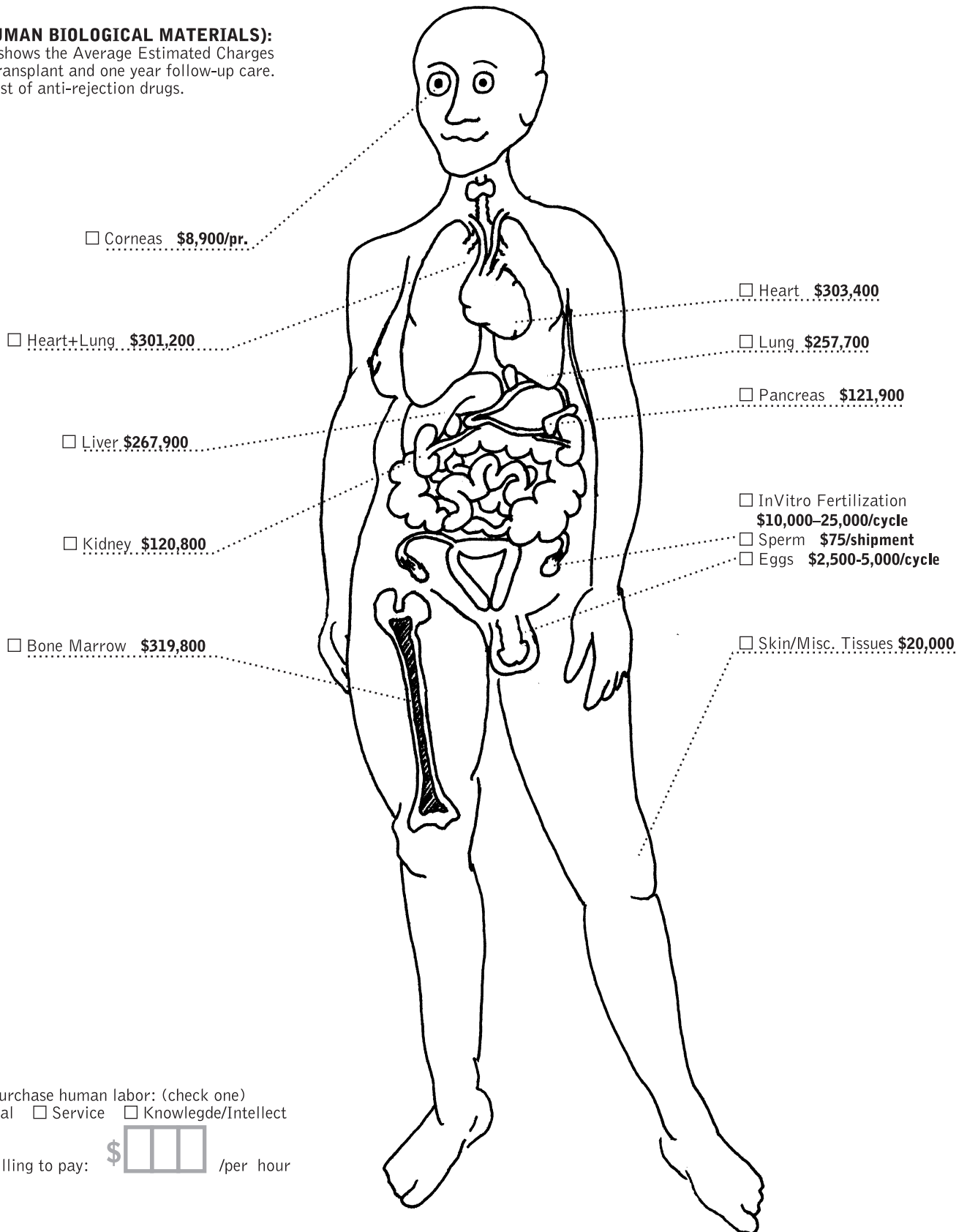
Buyer's Flesh Market Costs
